DNR Clean Water Fund Program

• Types of projects:

Wastewater/Stormwater/Collection systems Small Loan Program

Type of funding:

Subsidized loans – Current Subsidy:

- 70% of market rate;
- 0% interest Non-traditional projects (Adaptive management/nutrient trading)

Proposed in 2017 – 2019 Biennial Budget:

- 55% of market rate
- 33% of market rate (disadvantaged municipalities)
 - Municipal population <10,000
 - Median Household Income (MHI) <80% of WI MHI
- 0% interest ("extremely" disadvantaged municipalities)
 - Municipal population < 1000
 - MHI < 65% of WI MHI

Principal Forgiveness

 Qualifying projects/disadvantaged municipalities until funds run out (funding levels determined on an annual basis by Congress)

DNR Clean Water Fund Program (cont'd)

Timing:

Intent to Apply deadline: October 31st

Application deadline: September 30th (for municipalities seeking principal forgiveness)

Loans closed within 8 months of project "acceptance"

Projects accepted by June 30th of SFY of application

Continuous funding cycle for projects not qualifying or seeking PF funding

• Miscellaneous:

Small Loan Program

< \$2,000,000 project cost

Interest Rate Subsidy for Ioan through the State Trust Fund

DNR Safe Drinking Water Loan Program

Types of projects:

Municipal drinking water systems

• Wells, mains, treatment, etc.

Types of Funding

- Subsidized loans
- 55% of market rate
- 33% of market rate
 - Municipal population <10,000
 - Median Household Income (MHI) <80% of WI MHI

 Qualifying projects/disadvantaged municipalities until funds run out (funding levels determined on an annual basis by Congress)

DNR Safe Drinking Water Loan Program (cont'd)

• Timing:

- Intent to Apply deadline: October 31st
 - Must be received in order to apply for funding
- Application deadline: June 30th
- Loans closing deadline: June 30th of following year

CDBG Public Facilities

Types of projects:

Infrastructure reconstruction

- Wastewater
- Drinking water

Must meet one of the national objectives:

- Blight elimination
- Low-to-moderate income
- Urgent Local Need

Municipality MHI < 80% of county MHI OR communitywide and neighborhood income survey can be completed to determine LMI% for project beneficiaries.

Type of funding:

0

Grant (\$500,000 or 50% of eligible costs) 50% matching funds required

CDBG Public Facilities (cont'd)

• Timing:

- Application deadline May
- Grant Awards last week of July
- Project must be completed within 2 years of receiving funding

USDA-Rural Development

Types of Projects:

- Drinking water system improvements
- Wastewater system improvements
- Storm sewer systems

Type of Funding

- Subsidized 40 year term loans
- Grants (0% 75% based on MHI and Health Standards)
 - Typical grants = 15% 30% of project cost
 - MHI must be less than \$56,439 in order to qualify for grant
 - MHI less than \$45,151 and Health issue to qualify for 45% - 75% grant

USDA-Rural Development (cont'd)

- Interest rate tied to 11 Bond Index
 - Currently Poverty at 2.0% (MHI less than \$45,151 and health issue)
 - Intermediate 2.75% (MHI between \$45,151 and \$56,439)
 - Market 3.25 (MHI greater than \$56,439)
- Timing
 - Loan and grant awarded at the preliminary design phase
 - Project must be completely constructed within 5 years of approval
 - Open application cycle, applications accepted anytime
 - Funding is authorized based on a 10/1-9/30 fiscal year
 - Funds are typically pooled in May and August

USDA-Rural Development (cont'd)

- Miscellaneous
 - Loan Approval authority at \$5 million in WI
 - National Approval authority needed over \$5 million
 - Largest loan in state is at \$20 million
 - I 80 Rural utilities financed by Rural Development in WI
 - Grant allocation typically around \$8 million
 - \$450 million in outstanding loan portfolio
 - RD can finance connection fees to regional treatment facilities
